



April 15th is Arts Advocacy Day

To celebrate Arts, Culture and Creativity month, <u>Californians for the Arts</u> will be hosting a <u>Virtual Arts Advocacy Day</u> on **Wednesday, April 15th, from 10:00am to 6:00pm**. Each

event on the schedule has its own Zoom session and short registration form so attendees can pick and choose when and where they want to participate. Of course, you are invited to attend all sessions!

The day will begin with an hour of live performances, followed by a session about statewide advocacy organizations. a virtual lunch hour, and a session about why Arts, Culture and Creativity are essential for California. There will be a workshop to teach you how to write an op-ed and advocacy letter, and the day will end with a virtual jam session and happy hour. Sierra Poetry Festival 2020

On **Saturday, April 18th**, the Sierra Poetry Festival is going virtual and is free to all! The full day of online events begins at 8:45am in Amsterdam with three young poets (Isadora Goudsblom, Nadia de Vries, and Jonas Van de Pool) in conversation with <u>Rachel Teferet</u>.

This will be followed by opening comments by Festival Director, and Nevada County Arts Executive Director, Eliza Tudor and Shelly Covert, Spokesperson for the Nesenan Tribe and Nevada City Rancheria, California.

The keynote speaker will be poet <u>Ellen Bass</u>. There will be readings by <u>Dana Gioia</u>, <u>Coleman Barks</u>, and <u>Lisa Starr</u>, followed by workshops, additional readings, an open mic session, <u>The Poetry Crashers</u> and <u>Poetry Out Loud</u>.

Critical bridge building tools, including a Cultural Equity Convening, are emerging through creative practices as we meet.

In 2019, Nevada County Arts Council conducted a seminal study of cultural assets for their economic impact; completed a key survey of arts education in our schools; and received an unprecedented amount of state funding. They also launched, continued and/or supported a number of other key initiatives including <u>Forest-Fire</u>, <u>Sierra Poetry</u>

Festival, Nisenanim Ni, The Business of Art, Belonging, and Nevada County Poet Laureate Program,.

Through education programs, promotional tools, service to artists, and work with California Cultural Districts, they continue to share with the world how important the creative community is to the holistic health of Nevada County.




Grass Valley-Nevada City is one of 14 districts selected by The California Arts Council to serve as California's inaugural state-designated Cultural Districts. Each one of us is an


