

that city. This appearance marks the second performance on the ensemble's first ever U.S. tour.


The program includes:

"After the Gold Rush" with Hank Meals

On **Tuesday, November 19th, at 7pm,** local history buff, archaeologist and author Hank Meals will present "After the Gold Rush" at the <u>North Columbia Schoolhouse Cultural</u>

<u>Center</u> at 17894 Tyler-Foote Road. This is the fourth presentation in his five-part series,

"Just Enough - A Regional History Course",

The Yuba and Bear Rivers have played a major role in California's history. Former players and incidents in this dramatic story have influenced science, industry and ethics on a world-wide scale with good and bad consequences.

It won't be the dense and dull history that you endured in High School, but "just enough", Meals says, "to make you somewhat legacy literate. I've found that knowing what happened in your neighborhood makes you see a place differently, gives it extra texture and creates a sense of regional pride and ownership."

The 90-minute presentation includes unique historical and contemporary photos, maps and diagrams and will be followed by a Q & A. Admission is \$10 at the door or online.




Chris Perondi's Stunt Dog Experience

On Friday, November 22nd, <u>The Center for the Arts</u> will present <u>Chris Perondi's Stunt Dog</u> <u>Experience</u> at the Veterans Memorial Auditorium located at 225 South Auburn Street in Grass Valley. There will be two shows: a matinee at 1pm and an evening performance at 7pm.

With a cast of up to a dozen humans and two dozen dogs, this high energy performance will delight audiences of all ages. With amazing tricks, big air stunts, comedy antics, dancing dogs, and athletic feats, it is the most entertaining show of its kind! All of the dogs are rescue dogs, and Chris will talk about caring for dogs, why they are so valuable and the benefits of rescuing animals.

The Stunt Dog Experience has been featured on David Letterman, the Ellen Degeneres Show, Queen Latifah, the Tonight Show with Jay Leno and many more. Tickets are \$15 for children 13 and younger, \$25 for members of The Center for the Arts, and \$30 for the public.



"The Cauldron Crone" at The Colfax Theatre

This will be an evening of haunted theater with spooky stories, marionettes, and shadow puppets. A six-piece chamber ensemble joins MacAlpin, performing specially composed songs and instrumental pieces..



Cornish Christmas

Grass Valley's 52nd annual Cornish Christmas begins on **Friday, November 29th from 6-9pm** on Mill and Main Streets in historic downtown Grass Valley. Cornish Christmas will also take place on December 6th, 13th and 20th.

Started in 1967 as a way to preserve Grass Valley's Cornish heritage and holiday traditions, Cornish Christmas remains one of their most popular events. Mill and West Main Streets are closed to motorized traffic and filled with the sights and sounds of an old fashioned Christmas; carolers, jugglers, musicians, magicians, the Grass Valley Cornish Carol Choir, Tommyknocker Cloggers, and Santa Claus. Handmade arts and craft from artists throughout California are displayed on the historic downtown Grass Valley streets. Delicious food and drink can be purchased from a number of Grass Valley restaurants and specialty food vendors.

Pause at the steps of the historic Union Building as the Cornish Carol Choir performs traditional homeland Christmas carols each Friday at 6pm and 7pm. Enjoy the wide selection of holiday music offered by local Grass Valley musicians amongst the trappings of an historic gold rush town. This is a "rain or shine" event and is free to the public.


They will also have yummy treats, holiday music and free gift wrapping.
