The Fund offers micro-grants of up to \$5,000 for which our creative sector organizations and small business are eligible to apply, along with an easy application process.



### KEY FINDINGS | COVID-19 ARTS & CULTURE EARLY IMPACT SURVEY



Nevada County Arts Council issued a creative sector survey for individuals and organizations on March 28, 2020 to gather early data on the impacts of the COVID-19 public health emergency. 257 submissions were received at the closing of this initial survey on April 18, 2020.

With nearly 800 pre-registered online attendees, and thousands more via <u>Sierra</u> <u>Poetry Festival</u> Facebook's Livestream, our outreach to viewers and participants was global including 6 continents and 21 countries.

None of us planned for COVID-19, yet we continued on - separated by great distances and in isolation from one another - resulting in a more intimate festival than ever before.
